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Declaration made by the delegate of Sweden, which is not subject to ratification
[*Translation.*]

On behalf of the Royal Swedish Government, I recognise, in relation to any other Member or State accepting the same obligation, that is to say, on the sole condition of reciprocity, the jurisdiction of the Court as compulsory, *ipso facto* and without special convention, for a period of ten years to be reckoned from the date on which the Swedish Declaration of August 16th, 1921, ceases to be in force.

Declaration made by the delegate of Switzerland
[*Translation.*]

On behalf of the Swiss Confederation and subject to ratification, the undersigned recognises, in relation to any other Member of the League of Nations or State accepting the same obligation, that is to say, on the sole condition of reciprocity, the jurisdiction of the Court as compulsory, *ipso facto* and without special convention, for a period of ten years to be reckoned as from the deposit of the instrument of ratification.
